Petal Cone Bat Box

Supplies: (Shop Online 24/7 at juliedavison.stampinup.net)

- Basic Black cardstock
- Whisper White cardstock
- Petal Cone Die (Big Shot)
- Spider Web Embossing Folder (Big Shot)
- 2 1/2" Circle Punch
- 1/2" Circle Punch
- 1-3/8" Circle Punch
- Petite Pennant Builder Punch
- 1/16" Hole Punch
- Crop-a-Dile
- Bold Brights Glimmer Brads
- Vanilla Shimmer Smooch Spritz
- Dazzling Details Glitter Glue
- 1/4" Basic Black grosgrain ribbon
- Paper Piercing Tool
- Sticky Strip

Directions:

1. Cut 3 Petal Cones with the Petal Cone die and the Big Shot.
2. Cut off the round flaps on all three pieces.
3. Cut one of those apart so there are two triangles (the bat's wings). Score $\frac{1}{2}$ " from the straight end on each triangle. Use the Spider Web Embossing Folder to emboss the two triangles. Use the $1\text{-}\frac{3}{8}$ " Circle to create notches on each wing.
4. Spritz the Petal Cone die cuts and bat wings with Vanilla Shimmer Smooch Spritz.
5. Use the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Circle Punch on each straight end of the Petal Cone die cuts (not the wings) to create the concave shape of the bat's head.
6. Apply Sticky Strip to all tabs (including the ends of the wings) and assemble the petal cone box as you normally would. Adhere the wings on opposite sides of the cone.
7. Use the $\frac{1}{16}$ " Hole Punch to punch two holes approximately 1 inch apart on the front of the box for the eyes. Punch two $\frac{1}{2}$ " circles from Whisper White cardstock. Pierce a hole in the middle of each circle and put a Pumpkin Pie glimmer brad through the hole. Put the brad through the hole on the box and secure in place.
8. Punch two small triangles from the Petite Pennant Builder Punch and snip off the ends for the bat's fangs. Attach the fangs to the front of the box under the eyes. Use the Dazzling Details Glitter Glue to draw a mouth.
9. Use the crop-a-dile to punch holes behind each wing. Tie a ribbon through the holes. Fill the box with candy or a gift.
