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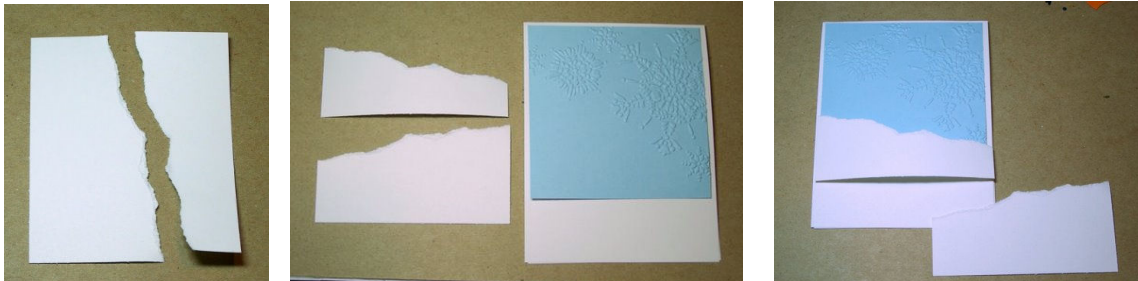
Owl Punch Penguin Card

Cardstock Dimensions:

- 4 1/4" x 11" Whisper White cardstock
- 4" x 4" Bashful Blue cardstock
- 3" x 4 1/4" Whisper White cardstock
- (2) 2 3/4" x 4 1/4" Whisper White cardstock
- (2) 2 3/4" x 4 1/4" Basic Black cardstock
- (2) 2 3/4" x 4 1/4" Pumpkin Pie cardstock

Directions:

1. Fold the Whisper White cardstock in half to create the card base.
2. Use the Northern Flurry embossing folder with the Big Shot to emboss the Bashful Blue cardstock. Adhere it to Whisper White card base, approximately 1/8" from the top of the card. Whisper White cardstock.
3. Tear the 3" x 4 1/4" Whisper White cardstock in half, length-wise, at a slight curve. Flip one side over and layer to create the effect of snow hills. (See photos.)



4. Apply 2-Way Glue over the tears and parts of the embossing snowflakes and add Dazzling Diamonds Glitter. Stamp the "Very Merry" greeting from the Short and Sweet stamp set using Bashful Blue ink.
5. Use the [Two-Step Owl Punch](#) to punch from the Whisper White, Basic Black, and Pumpkin Pie cardstock. Use the pieces as shown to assemble two penguins. Cut off the ears on both the Pumpkin Pie and Basic Black bodies. Cut the feet off the Basic Black body and glue it over the Pumpkin Pie body so that the Pumpkin Pie feet show. Add the white belly and then the Pumpkin Pie heart for the nose, which will be covered on top by the eyes. Adhere the penguins to the card using Stampin' Dimensionals.



Tips for the Owl Punch:

- The [Two-Step Owl Punch](#) is designed to be used while the punch is lying flat on a table with two hands pressing down on the punch. You can turn it upside down to see where you are punching and doing so will not harm the punch, but you will probably find that it is easier to punch when it is flat.
- The teeny tiny eyeball included in this Two-Step punch can be tricky. For easier handling, dip the tip of the paper piercing needle in a liquid glue (such as the Tombow Multi Adhesive). Gently roll the adhesive from the tip of the needle to the small dot of cardstock. Pick up the dot using the needle point and adhere it to the other circle to create an eye.
